What is Proposition X?

Proposition X is a school classroom, safety and repair measure that provides \$59.4 million in funds necessary to address the critical and urgent needs of schools in the South Bay Union School District

Proposition X will fund the repairs and improvements needed to ensure that the 9,000 elementary students attending our schools are in a safe, healthy and quality learning environment.

Why is Proposition X important to our community?

Quality elementary schools are essential to a thriving community. They make a difference in student achievement, student and community safety, and improved property values. Proposition X is a great example of this community's commitment to quality education.

How have projects been identified?

Our classrooms and school facilities required major upgrades and improvements to meet today's safety, technological, and educational standards. A Long Range Facilities Master Plan Committee assessed each school site and worked to ensure that a comprehensive master plan was developed for each school. A priority list of projects to be implemented in the first two phases of Proposition X was developed.

What specific improvements will Proposition X fund?

Some specific improvements that Proposition X will fund include:

- Making health and safety improvements, including removing asbestos, upgrading electrical systems, and replacing outdated fire alarms
- Improving student access to computers and modern technology
- Modernizing classrooms, restrooms and cafeterias
- Making handicap accessibility (ADA) improvements
- Repairing and replacing deteriorating plumbing and sewer systems

How can I be sure Proposition X funds will be spent wisely and as specified?

Passing Proposition X qualifies the District for approximately \$17 million in matching state funds. Laws governing Proposition X prohibit spending any bond funds on administrator salaries or district operating expenses. Proposition X funds will remain in our community to benefit local schools and residents. It will not only maintain the quality of our schools and our property values, but also maintain the quality of our community.

An Independent Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) consisting of local senior citizens, homeowners, parents, taxpayers, and others was appointed to monitor and publicly report on the expenditure of bond funds, ensuring they are properly and effectively spent on facilities needs as specified in the Proposition X bond language.
